Until his retirement from the law in 2020, John specialised in international marine transactional work and for several years headed Clyde & Co's superyacht group, having joined the firm in 1997 and becoming a partner in 2003. His practice ranged from advising the owners and builders of some of the world's most luxurious superyachts, to being counsel to operators in the oil support industry. In 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 Chambers HNW Guide to The World's Leading High Net Worth Advisers ranked John in the top band of global Superyacht lawyers. As one of the top four lawyers in the industry he was described by peers and clients as a "very good negotiator" and "very precise and thorough in his work". One industry insider described him as having an "encyclopaedic knowledge of the sector. I would speak to him regarding anything in the practice area. He knows it all" "An old style gentleman, he is very calm and highly educated". He is a podcaster and a freelance Superyacht journalist.
