II. SECRETARY'S REPORT

A. Minutes of March 4, 2023, Board Meeting in Charleston, South Carolina

Secretary Powers presented the Minutes of the March 4, 2023, Board Meeting in Charleston, South Carolina.

ON MOTION DULY MADE AND SECONDED, the Board unanimously approved the minutes of the March 4, 2023, meeting of the Board of Directors.

Secretary Powers presented a proposed amendment to Bylaw 209 by concluding the current wording of the bylaw with the following sentence, "Upon completion of such post or position, an Ex-Officio member who is admitted to the practice of law before any of the several courts in the United States shall be invited to become a Proctor member of the Association."

ON MOTION DULY MADE AND SECONDED, the Board unanimously approved the proposed amendment to Bylaw 209

III. TREASURER'S REPORT

A. Quarterly Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Connor reported that the finances of the Association for the three-month quarter ended March 31, 2023, were in fine shape, consistent with their status on January 1, 2023.

B. Dues Status

Treasurer Connor reported that just over 50% of the Members have paid their annual dues, totaling \$208,380, which is less than the usual average of approximately 75% of the Members having paid their annual dues by the Spring meeting. Treasurer Connor explained that the discrepancy is likely the result of the dues statements being sent a month later than normal because of a computer glitch. Treasurer Connor anticipates that most Members will bring their dues current by the end of the year.

C. Changes to Banking System

Treasurer Connor reported that all but \$1,000 has been transferred from the Association's Dinner Account to a HSBC Money Market Account to take advantage of recent higher interest rates.

Treasurer Connor made a motion for the Board to grant signature authority to The President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Treasurer, and Andrea Casillas of Group Concepts on the Association's Money Market Accounts with HSBC and Citibank.

ON MOTION DULY MADE AND SECONDED, the Board unanimously authorized The President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Treasurer, and Andrea Casillas of Group Concepts to have signature authority for the Association's Money Market Accounts with HSBC and Citibank.

ON MOTION DULY MADE AND SECONDED, the Board unanimously approved the Treasurer's Report.

V. WEBSITE AND TECHNOLOGY SECRETARY'S REPORT

Website and Technology Secretary Krieger reported that the Association continues the process of migrating its database to a more robust platform and expects the final stages of the migration to be ready for testing within a month. Ms. Krieger estimated that after successful testing, the migration would be completed soon thereafter.

Ms. Krieger also reported on the need for better coordination between the Committee chairs offering remote attendance and the law firms hosting the meetings, especially in the context of involvement by the law firms' IT departments.

ON MOTION DULY MADE AND SECONDED, the Board unanimously approved the Website and Technology Secretary's Report.

VI. BOARD COMMITTEE REPORTS, UPDATES

A. Policy for Posting Notices on Association's Website

First Vice President Hurley reported on the progress of the working group tasked with formulating guidelines and policies regarding posting by Members on the MLA website and *LinkedIn* page, as well as use of the MLA logo by members on social media postings. First Vice

President Hurley advised the Board that a draft proposal would be circulated in the coming weeks for comment and discussion at the Summer Board meeting.

B. Committee Chairs and Board Liaisons

Second Vice President Moseley reported on the meeting of the Committee Chairs, during which the Chairs gave brief reports on their respective agendas for the Spring Committee meetings. Second Vice President Moseley thanked Director Shaukat for addressing the Committee Chairs regarding CLE programs and reporting requirements for credits. Second Vice President Moseley also reported on a survey that will be sent to the Committee Chairs requesting their input for CLE planning and venue needs, especially in relation to the Fall meeting of the Association in San Francisco. Finally, Second Vice President Moseley reported that eight Committee Chairs will have completed their terms following the Spring meeting and that he and President Holland would be working to appoint new Chairs for those Committees.

VII. DISCUSSION TOPICS

Immediate Past President Farrell reported on the Nominating Committee's slate of proposed nominees for election of officers and directors to be presented to the membership at the General Meeting of the Association.

President Holland led a discussion on a draft Resolution urging the United States Senate to ratify the United Nations Convention on the International Effects of Judicial Sales of Ships. Based upon comments from the Board, President Holland stated that the Resolution would undergo further editing and be presented to the Board for a vote in advance of the Comité Maritime International's Montreal Colloquium on June 14-16, 2023.

President Holland congratulated Past President Frank Nolan for his election to the Executive Council of the Comité Maritime International.

VIII. FUTURE MEETINGS AND EVENTS

President Holland led a discussion regarding planning for the 125th Anniversary celebrations, including the venues and attendance criteria for the evening events during the 2024 Spring meeting in New York.

Director Tom Wynne reported on the itinerary for the Summer 2023 Board of Directors meeting at Mackinac Island, Michigan.

At the invitation of President Holland, Norman Stockman, Chair of the Planning Committee, appeared before the Board to discuss the itinerary for the Fall meeting in San Francisco during October 18-21, 2023.

IX. NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business proposed.

X. ADJOURN

After thanking the Board of Directors for their service, and there being no further business of the Board of Directors of The Maritime Law Association of the United States, President Holland adjourned the meeting at 11:56 a.m.
