

Richard Corwin is a graduate of Lafayette College (1967, A.B. in psychology) and of the School of Law of St. John's University (1970, J.D.) where he won the Louis R. Harolds Admiralty Prize and an American Jurisprudence Admiralty Award. Mr. Corwin began his career with the New York Law Offices of Donald F. Mooney. In 1971 he joined the law firm of Haight, Gardner, Poor & Havens (now Holland & Knight) as an Associate Attorney. At Haight Gardner Mr. Corwin handled personal injury cases, collisions, cargo claims, and contract disputes. In 1975 with three other attorneys he started Walker & Corsa where his litigation and arbitration practice involved groundings, vessel losses, contract (including passenger ticket) disputes, litigation arising out of death and foreign seamen claims, and all manner of maritime dispute including cargo claims. After 20 years as a partner at Walker & Corsa, Mr. Corwin joined Trimar Defense Services, Inc., as president. Trimar is a claims handling organization and is the general correspondent for North America for Gard Services AS, managers of the Assuranceforeningen Gard P & I Club and of the Marine and Energy insurance activities of If P&C Insurance Ltd. Mr. Corwin is a member of the Maritime Law Association of the United States and of its Maritime Arbitration and Mediation Committee (and that committee's "Liason with Society of Maritime Arbitrators" subcommittee). He is a member of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York (and its Admiralty Committee) and is an associate member of the Association of Average Adjustors of the United States.
