Appeal in Admiralty as New Trial.

February, 1927.

The President of the Association has appointed T. Catesby Jones, George De Forest Lord, John C. Prizer, Charles W. Dutch and Leslie M. Krusen as a Committee to deal with the following resolution, passed at the January meeting of the Association:

“RESOLVED that the President be empowered to appoint a committee of five to examine the present state of the law and practice under the decision of *The John Twohy*, to report to the next meeting whether any change in the law would be desirable, and, if so, what change should be urged.”

At a preliminary conference it was the sense of the New York members of the Committee that in view of the definite but divergent views expressed at the last meeting of the Association, the Committee should give each member of the Association an opportunity to be heard before taking up the questions submitted to it for consideration and report. Accordingly, the Committee invites any member of the Association who may desire to do so, to give it the benefit of his views on the subject of the resolution.
