The Special Committee on Calendar Practice in the Southern District of New York advises that the non-jury calendar during the coming term will be divided into an Admiralty section and an Equity, etc., section. The Admiralty section has been re-numbered, and numbers 1 to 1,150 are expected to be tried during the coming winter.

Informal arrangements have also been made between Judge Knox and Judge Campbell to bring about the appointment of the same commissioner when suits are brought in the Southern and Eastern districts against the same vessel.

The amendment to the Suits in Admiralty Act, reopening the time for suit in certain causes until the end of this year, which was endorsed by the Association on May 13th, was thereafter passed by Congress and signed by the President and became law on June 30, 1932. The text is printed in the July issue of American Maritime Cases at page 1155.
