INTERNATIONAL MARITIME COMMITTEE

The Oslo Conference, held August 22-25, 1933, sent back to
 Committee the proposals as to jurisdiction and penal sanctions in
 cases of collision at sea; civil jurisdiction in cases of collision at sea;
 and arrest of ships. The British delegation expressed the view of
 many of those present in urging that the existing conventions be
 pressed for enactment into national laws before new projects are
 taken up.

The Committee is not holding a meeting in 1934. The Inter-
 national Law Association will meet this year at Budapest, on Sep-
 tember 3, 1934.
