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**ANNUAL DINNER-MEETING**

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The *Annual Meeting* will be held in the Carter and Evarts Rooms at the building of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York, 42 West 44th Street, New York City, on Friday, May 3, 1946, at 4 P. M., preceded by the meeting of the Executive Committee at 3:30 P. M. At a later date more detailed notice will be given of the subjects to be discussed at the meeting.

The *Annual Dinner-Meeting* will be held on Friday evening, May 3, 1946, at the Hotel Roosevelt, Madison Avenue & 45th Street, New York City. (Last year The University Club was unable to accommodate the large numbers who desired to attend.) Business dress only is expected.

Honorable George Murray Hulbert, United States District Judge for the Southern District of New York and Honorable William F. Smith, United States District Judge for the District of New Jersey have accepted the invitations of the Association to address our dinner-meeting. The Judges of the United States Circuit Courts of Appeals for the First, Second and Third Circuits, and of the District Courts for the Southern and Eastern Districts of New York are being invited to the dinner as guests of the Association. If any member will please advise the Secretary the names of any Federal Judges from other circuits or districts who are likely to be in or near New York, the Association will be delighted to invite them also to attend the dinner as guests.

Seating will be at tables of ten, and seats will be allotted by the Dinner Committee in the order in which reservations are received. The charge for the dinner (including tip and cocktails) is \$6.00 for members, and \$8.00 for guests, who must be invited by members. Cocktails will be served at 6:45 P. M. Dinner will be served at 7:30 P. M.

We are obliged to inform the Hotel Roosevelt well in advance as to the number who will attend the dinner. It is important, therefore, if you expect to attend, that you promptly fill out the enclosed reservation form and return it with your check to the *Treasurer*, Thomas H.
