**ANNUAL FALL DINNER**

The Annual Fall Dinner of the Association will be held on Friday evening, November 21, 1952 at the Biltmore Hotel, Madison Avenue and 43rd Street, New York City. Hon. Thomas F. Murphy, United States District Judge for the Southern District of New York, will be the guest of honor. The Judges of the United States Courts of Appeal for the First, Second and Third Circuits and of the District Courts for the Southern and Eastern Districts of New York, as well as the District Judges of New Jersey, Boston and Philadelphia, will be invited to the dinner as guests of the Association. If any member will advise the Secretary of the names of any Federal Judges from other Circuits or Districts who are likely to be in or near New York at about the time of the meeting, the Executive Committee will be pleased to invite them also as guests. Cocktails will be served at 6:45 P. M. and dinner will be served at 7:45 P. M. Dress will be optional.

At a recent meeting of the Executive Committee it was voted to permit each member to invite one guest to the forthcoming Annual Fall Dinner until an aggregate of 200 guests is reached, after which no further reservations for guests will be accepted. If you intend to invite a guest it is particularly important to send in your reservation promptly, otherwise the quota may have been filled. If you are delayed in sending in your reservation or are in doubt as to whether guest reservations are still available you should communicate with the Chairman of the Dinner Committee.

The charge for the dinner, including cocktails, is \$9.00 for members and \$12.00 for guests.

Under our contract, we are obliged to inform the Biltmore Hotel well in advance as to the number who will attend the dinner. It is
