FIFTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL MEETING

The Fifty-Eighth Annual Meeting of the Association will be held at the Association of the Bar of the City of New York, 42 West 44th Street, New York City, on Friday, May 17, 1957, at 2:00 P. M., preceded by a meeting of the Executive Committee. At a later date more detailed notice will be given of the subjects to be discussed at the meeting.

The Annual Dinner Meeting for members of the Association and their guests will be held on Friday evening, May 17, 1957 at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, Park Avenue and Fiftieth Street, New York City. The Grand Ballroom of the hotel with its attendant spacious accommodations has been made available to us for the Dinner.

The Judges of the United States Court of Appeals for the First, Second and Third Circuits and of the District Courts for the Southern and Eastern Districts of New York, as well as the District Judges of New Jersey, Boston and Philadelphia will be invited to the dinner as guests of the Association. If any member will advise the Secretary of the names of any Federal Judges from other Circuits or Districts who are likely to be in or near New York at about the time of the meeting, the Executive Committee will be pleased to invite them also as guests.
