SIXTY-FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING

The Sixty-Fifth Annual Meeting of the Association will be held at the New York County Lawyers Association, 14 Vesey Street, New York City, on Friday, May 1, 1964 at 2:00 P. M.

The Annual Dinner Meeting for members of the Association and their guests will be held on Friday evening, May 1, 1964 at the Hotel Commodore, Lexington Avenue and Forty-Second Street, New York City. The Grand Ballroom of the hotel with its attendant spacious accommodations has been made available to us for the dinner.
