The Annual Dinner for members of the Association and their guests will be held on Friday evening, May 6, 1966, in the Grand Ballroom of The Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, Park Avenue and 50th Street, New York City. Cocktails will be served in the Jade and Basildon Suite at 6:45 P. M. and dinner will be served in the Grand Ballroom at 7:45 P. M.

The charge for the Dinner, including cocktails, will be \$15.00 for members and \$22.50 for guests.

The preferred dress will be black tie.
