**PRELIMINARY INFORMATION ABOUT 1966 FALL
MEETING AND DINNER**

1. The 1966 fall meeting of the Association will be held at the Roosevelt Hotel, New Orleans, Louisiana, Friday, November 4, 1966, at 10:30 A. M.

The 1966 fall dinner, for members of the Association and their ladies, will be held Friday evening at the Roosevelt Hotel, New Orleans, preceded by the usual cocktails. It will be a dinner dance, with music furnished by the orchestra of René Louapre.

The charge for the dinner, including cocktails, will be \$20.00 per person.

This is merely for information. Please send no money at this stage. Formal notice, with appropriate forms for dinner reservations, expression of preference with regard to fish or meat course, etc., will follow in the regular course.

2. A block of rooms has been set aside for the visiting members at the Roosevelt Hotel for November 3rd through 5th. Specific reservations from this block of rooms must be made through the New Orleans group. Some members may already have made reservations individually, but those members who desire that reservations be made for them by the New Orleans group should complete the attached slip and forward it *promptly* to:

Reservations made through Mrs. Campbell can only be held until 6:00 P. M. of the date of arrival unless different arrangements are made by the member directly with the hotel. Further, the hotel has stated that it will have to release any rooms unreserved from this block by October 20th.

3. It is hoped that visiting members will plan to arrive in New Orleans by noon, Thursday, November 3rd. The New Orleans group will maintain a registration desk at the Roosevelt Hotel,

Thursday, November 3rd, from noon until 5.00 P. M., and Friday, November 4th, 9:00 A. M. to 5:00 P. M. All visiting members will be requested to register as promptly as possible after arrival.

4. The New Orleans group will entertain at a reception and cocktail party, 6:30 to 8:30 P. M., Thursday, November 3rd. Invitations will be forwarded at the time of forwarding tickets to the dinner.

It is hoped that this will be held at the Plimsoll Club, atop the new International Trade Mart Building, on the bank of the Mississippi River, at the foot of Canal Street. Unfortunately, doubt still exists as to whether the Plimsoll Club will actually be open and functioning in time, and, in the unfortunate event that it is not, an alternative place has been provided.

5. For the visiting ladies:

- (a) There will be a Garden District tour Friday morning November 4th, from 10:00 A. M. to noon at the cost of approximately \$4.00 per participant. The tours include visiting three or four ante-bellum homes. Bus transportation will be available.
- (b) The walking tour will be followed by lunch which, because of limited accommodations, will be in three separate groups, at a cost of approximately \$5.00 per person.
- (c) There will be a guided walking tour of the French Quarter, Saturday morning, November 6th, 11:00 A. M. to 1:00, in groups not more than 15 each at approximate cost of \$2.00 per person.

The tour of Friday morning will coincide with the regular fall meeting of the Association. While intended principally for the visiting ladies, the tours of Saturday morning may also be joined by the husbands, if they desire.

Please indicate on the attached slip which of these events your wives would like to attend. Please do not send any money, but enclose the completed slip in an envelope to Mrs. Doris Campbell. What is needed now is a reasonably accurate estimate of the numbers of participants, so that proper arrangements may be completed.

5. The original hope of chartering a plane for New York members has not materialized, because the cost was found to be completely prohibitive. The desirability of transportation reserva-

tions well in advance is specially called to the attention of visiting members, and to that of the New York members in particular.
